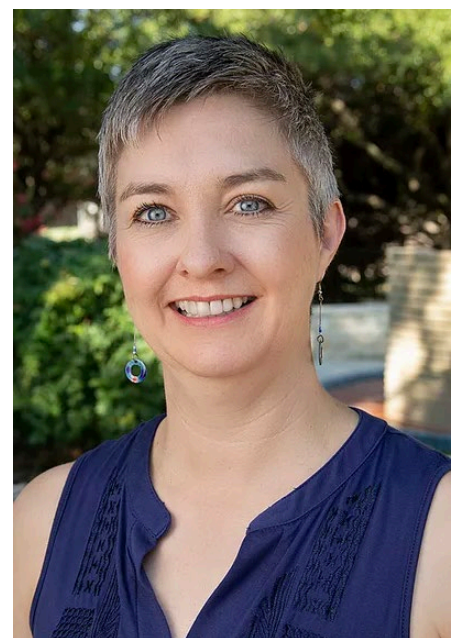
Ringling Museum Restoring Aeolian Organ

If you've toured the Ca'd'Zan mansion near the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art, you've no doubt seen the grand court's Aeolian Organ Opus 1559. Built in 1924, this organ once provided background music for the dinner parties of John and Mable Ringling. With a \$1.5 million grant from the Wyncote Foundation combined with \$245,000 raised from local donors during the Ringling's fundraising efforts, Parsons Pipe Organ Builders of Canandaigua, New York will perform restoration work over the next two years.
